- A minimum of three years of teaching experience at the elementary level
- Experience teaching reading, writing, social studies, and mathematics at the elementary level

- Ability and desire to establish a strong rapport with students and engage classes in developmentally-appropriate lessons using various modalities and materials
- Practical knowledge of child development and early childhood/elementary education pedagogy
- Strong interest and proficiency in planning and implementing a child-centered, hands-on curriculum using varied modalities and materials that meet student needs and interests
- Awareness of different learning styles and experience differentiating instruction for students in one classroom
