Qualified applicants will meet the following criteria:

- Experience teaching middle or high school students
- Outstanding interpersonal, communication, and organizational skills
- The ability to integrate technology into classroom instruction where appropriate.

Candidates should be

- Committed to student writing and research
- Able to use a range of instructional strategies to implement a student-centered approach
- Flexible and willing to innovate in curriculum, assessment, and teaching methods
- Committed to helping students one-on-one outside of the classroom and strong interest in working with students
- Committed to ongoing growth and development as a teacher and collaboration with colleagues

As guided by its Strategic Plan, MKA is committed to promoting multicultural education, grounded in ideas of equity, anti-bias education, anti-racism, and social justice.
