

# **Supply List For Incoming Seventh Graders 2019-2020**

#### General for all classes:

- · Loose leaf paper
- 2-3 packs of post-it notes
- Graph paper- (4 squares to an inch)
- Zipper pencil case with the following:
- Pencils
- Blue, black, red and green pens
- Colored pencils
- Several highlighters

# **English:**

• A separate one and a half inch three-ring binder exclusively for English **or** an English section in a larger three-ring binder; binder must have inside sleeves, folders, dividers

### **Social Studies:**

• 1-1" soft binder with pockets

#### **Science:**

- Small 3 ring binder or a folder that can hold worksheets
- Wide ruled composition notebook
- Graph paper composition notebook

#### Pre-Algebra:

- 4 spiral graph paper notebooks
- TI-30X-IIS Scientific calculator
- 3 ring binder or 3 folders with pockets
- 1 12" plastic ruler (for use at home)

# Algebra or Algebra IA:

- 4 spiral graph paper notebooks
- TI-84 Graphing calculator
- 3 ring binder or 3 folders with pockets
- 1 12" plastic ruler (for use at home)
- 1 composition journal

## World Language:

- 1-1" inch binder with loose leaf paper **or** a section in a larger 3-ring binder
- Pencil case
- Eraser
- 3 dry erase markers
- Earbuds to keep in World Language classroom

## **Technology:**

• 1 pair of earbuds

As you think ahead to seventh grade, consider what <u>system</u> you are going to use to organize your materials. We suggest using one of the following:

- an accordion expanding file folder (with 10-13 sections)
- a Case It or Trapper-Keeper-style case with an individual folder for each class and rings for workbooks, notebooks and a planner
- individual, color-coded binders for each class
- \*A single folder is not appropriate to hold all of your handouts and notes in the seventh grade. You may try out different systems, but you must have some sort of plan!

All items brought to school, including clothing should be clearly marked with student's name. Name tags on clothing is **Highly Recommended**, similar to those on <a href="http://www.namebubbles.com">http://www.namebubbles.com</a>, or written with a laundry marker, similar to Sharpie's Rub-A-Dub Laundry Marker.
