

Supply List for Incoming Fifth Graders 2022-2023

Dear Fifth Grader.

Please take a look at the three options presented for your organizational system. We have given some reasons you might choose each one. Only purchase <u>one option</u> for the start of the school year.

Option 1: Pendaflex Folder (example)

- 13 total sections
- Planner should go in front section (school planners will be provided to students who would like one)
- Folder for each section
- Allows additional sections for personal items (artwork, reminders, etc.)

Benefit: Useful for students who benefit from having everything in one place

Downside: computer does not fit, so that must be carried separately

Option 2: Multi-pocket folder, should be plastic coated (example)

- 10 pockets for different classes
- Planner would be carried separately

Benfit: Easy to see work and label classes

Downside: This might be an option for more organized students, as too many papers in this would begin to spill out. Also, it may not be as durable.

Option 3: Case-It (example)

- Contains accordion section for additional class items
- 1 three-hole punched folder for each subject (*must be purchased separately; different color for each class suggested)
- Inside pocket for school supplies
- Planner and laptop can go inside (also three-hole punched)

Benefit: Easy to put all materials in when transitioning between classes

Downside: It can get very heavy/bulky to carry.

On the following page is a checklist of all other supplies you will need for the year.

All items brought to school, including clothing, should be clearly marked with the student's name. Name tags on clothing are highly recommended, such as those on https://www.namebubbles.com/, or written with a laundry marker, similar to Sharpie's Rub-A-Dub Laundry Marker.

General supplies to be <u>kept at school</u>: (stored in locker and used when necessary)

- 2 boxes of pencils
- Personal hand-held pencil sharpener (one that holds the shavings)

- Erasers (either one big one or several pencil toppers)
- Zippered pencil holder (no pencil boxes)
- 1 box of colored pencils
- 4 highlighters
- 8 dry erase markers 4 of which should be fine point
- Dry erase eraser
- 4 pens (2 red & 2 black/blue)
- 2 packs of small Post-it notes
- 1 pack of loose-leaf paper, wide ruled, 100 count
- Headphones or earbuds

English Language Arts:

- 2 marble composition notebooks
- 1 two-pocket folder (to be left in classroom)
- Multiple packs of 3" x 3" Post-it notes

Social Studies:

- Pack of ruled index cards
- 1 marble composition notebook

Math:

- 1 12" plastic ruler with inches and centimeters
- TI 108 calculator
- 1 black marble composition notebook
- 9" x 12" dry erase board
- Dry erase markers
- Standard deck of playing cards

Science:

• 1 wide ruled marble composition notebook

World Language:

- 1" binder
- 5-6 dry erase markers
- Earbuds to keep in world language classroom

Items that fifth grade teachers recommend having at home to assist with homework:

- Pencils, erasers, pens, highlighters, colored markers, Sharpies
- Post-it notes, index cards
- Scotch tape, ruler, scissors, glue sticks
