

Supply List For Incoming Eighth Graders 2020-2021

As you think ahead to eighth grade, consider what system you are going to use to organize your materials. We suggest using one of the following:

- Case It or Trapper-Keeper style case with an individual folder for each class and 3-ring capabilities for workbooks, notebooks, and planner
- Individual, color-coded binders for each class

A single folder is not appropriate to hold all of your handouts and notes in the seventh grade. You may try out different systems, but you must have some sort of plan!

General classroom supplies:

- Loose leaf paper
- Hand- held 9"x12" dry erase board
- 1 pack of 12 dry erase markers
- 2-3 packs of Post-it notes
- Graph paper (4 squares to an inch)
- Zipper pencil case
- Pencils
- Blue, black, red, and green pens
- Colored pencils
- Several highlighters
- 1 pair of earbuds

Advisor:

- Composition notebook (any cover design)

English:

- A separate 1.5" 3-ring binder exclusively for English **OR** an English section in a larger 3-ring binder; binder must have inside sleeves, folders, and dividers.

Social Studies:

- 1" binder with pockets
- 1 package of index cards

Science:

- Small 3-ring binder **OR** a sturdy folder than can hold worksheets
- Paper notebook (student choice)
- Colored pencils, Pens, Pencils
- Student white board, approx. 9 x 12 (see general supplies above)
- dry erase markers (several colors, see general supplies above)
- Safety Goggles (tbd)

Algebra and Geometry:

- A small 3-ring binder exclusively for math **OR** a math section in a larger 3-ring binder
- Graph paper, 3-hole punched
- TI-84 Graphing calculator

- 12” plastic ruler (for use at home)
- 9”x12” dry erase board (see general supplies above)
- Dry erase markers (see general supplies above)

World Language:

- A small 3-ring binder **OR** a folder that can hold worksheets **OR** a section in a larger 3-ring binder
- 3 dry erase markers (see general supplies above)
- 9”x12” dry erase board (see general supplies above)
- Earbuds to keep in World Language classroom

All items brought to school, including clothing, should be clearly marked with student’s name.

Name tags on clothing is **Highly Recommended**, similar to those on <https://www.namebubbles.com/>, or written with a laundry marker, similar to Sharpie’s Rub-A-Dub Laundry Marker.
